Weed Committee Report

WLCA, a member funded not-for-profit association, has undertaken the following actions over the past few years that have significantly improved the weed situation on the lake in general and, hopefully, specifically at your location. The total annual cost in 2017 of the actions listed below was \$44,403.25.

1. Volunteer officers of WLCA presented evidence and repeatedly urged the Indiana Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) to change its prior policy of "knock down" weed treatments on the invasive Eurasian Milfoil in Webster Lake. Beginning in 2016, IDNR permitted WLCA to "treat to kill" milfoil in specified areas of the lake. Approximately 150 acres of milfoil were killed in 2016, 59 acres of milfoil were killed in the spring of 2017, and another 79 acres of *Continued on page 2.*

The purpose of WLCA is to control the inlet and outlet of Webster Lake; endeavor to keep the lake clean and safe for fishing, swimming and boating; and encourage the property owners and members to work together for the improvement of the lake in order to make the region healthful, restful and attractive, in the belief that doing so will help to enhance enjoyment of the lake and maintain and/or increase lake property values as well as benefit local businesses and the community as a whole.

Kline Island Protection Project Update

Phase II of the Kline Island project was completed in the fall of 2017. Eighty percent of the cost to complete Phase II was covered by a LARE grant, and 20% from The Watershed Foundation (TWF), WLCA and some in-kind work provided by the



United Methodist Epworth Church Camp (owner of Kline Island). WLCA has all of the permits in place to begin Phase III, which is to address the erosion around the east side of Kline Island, with the hope of being completed in the fall of 2018. This would complete the project that TWF, in conjunction with the church camp, WLCA and the IN Dept. of Natural Resources, undertook to protect Kline Island's shoreline from erosion into Webster Lake. In addition, TWF purchased six buoys, through a grant, for WLCA to place around the east side of Kline Island. The grant for the buoys was obtained through the Kosciusko County Convention, Recreation, and Visitors Commission. WLCA extends a huge "thank you" to TWF for their generous contribution to the Kline Island preservation project.

milfoil were killed in an unprecedented fall treatment in October of 2017. WLCA secured LARE grant funds from IDNR to help cover this cost.

- 2. Annually, WLCA covers 100% of the cost of at least one wholelake shoreline weed treatment to control the various plant species native to Webster Lake and a less harmful invasive type of Curlyleaf that are filling the voids in the lake bottom vegetation cover left by the elimination of the milfoil. In 2017, WLCA also paid for a separate early spring "knock down" treatment of Curlyleaf on the heavily weeded northeast end of the lake in an effort to minimize weed chop, regrowth, and shoreline clean-up by the property owners in that area.
- 3. For the 2018 season, the WLCA Board of Directors applied for a permit to do the annual shoreline treatment and a possible second shoreline treatment (full or partial) should the condition of the lake require it. WLCA also requested a permit and applied for a LARE grant to help cover the cost of treating the invasive species of Curlyleaf. As of the time of this writing, the status of these applications is "pending". An additional shoreline treatment could increase the annual treatment cost by as much as \$27,000 over last year's total of \$44,403.25.
- 4. WLCA has been contributing financially and with volunteer labor to the Kline Island preservation work being conducted by The Watershed Foundation in conjunction with the Epworth Forest Church Camp. Halting the erosion of nutrients and organic materials from this island into Webster Lake helps reduce weed growth and maintain water depth.
- 5. WLCA previously purchased Lorance equipment to use in mapping the vegetation in the lake. The mapping process requires between 35 and 40 man-hours per year. Previously, an independent contractor was paid to do this report. Volunteer officers of WLCA donate their time and boats in this mapping process. The information obtained from this process greatly impacts decisions relating to weed treatments.

- 6. The weed committee has been and continues to investigate optional treatments or harvesting methods that might be used on duck weed—those tiny green plants that float in great sheets on the water's surface and drift with the wind.
- 7. WLCA is studying the feasibility, costs, and grants available for some possible dredging projects. This research has just begun. Grants won't cover 100% of project costs. Most grants require at least 25% of the project cost to be borne by those receiving the immediate benefit of the project, WLCA, or a combination of both.

I hope the above information properly relays to you the dedication of the WLCA board and provides additional insight as to how WLCA's work with the IDNR is truly helping all of the owners and residents of Webster Lake and the community at large by keeping our waters navigable as well as fishable. Through our newsletters, website (www.lakewebster.net), and working relationship with The Watershed Foundation, WLCA is striving to keep property owners and boaters aware of the need to keep our water free of trash, sewage, fertilizer and nutrient runoff. To do more, WLCA needs to have a higher percentage of membership among those living on and/or using this lake. Our current percentage is approximately 50%, an increase over prior years. (Thank you.)

Please help by personally promoting membership in the WLCA to all of your friends and neighbors. Please maintain your membership and especially consider extra contributions towards the weed fund. Doing so will allow us to apply membership dollars currently spent on weed treatments to the costs of the new projects being studied. Description

We operated it as a non-profit museum, taking it to various rivertown festivals. With this experience I qualified to take the Coast Guard exam for operating commercial vessels up to 100 tons, which I received in 2005.
